Review of Operations and Earnings Results for the 6 Months Ended 31 December 2004

Results

The consolidated entity loss after income tax for the six months year period to 31 December 2004 was \$1,204,230 (2003: loss of \$1,299,228). The loss was due predominately to start-up costs associated with the Company's telecommunications business, which operates as a reseller of prepaid mobile communications.

Principal Activities

The principal activities of the consolidated entity are the provision of telecommunication services and internet based services.

Basis of preparation of half-year financial report





Independent review report to members of ComodiTel Ltd

Scope

The financial report and directors' responsibility

The financial report comprises the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, statement of cash flows and accompanying notes to the financial statements for the consolidated entity of ComodiTel Ltd and the entities it controlled during the half year, and the directors' declaration for the company, for the half year ended 31 December 2004.

The directors of the company are responsible for preparing a financial report that gives a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the consolidated entity and that complies with Accounting Standard AASB 1029 "Interim Financial Reporting", in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*. This includes responsibility for the maintenance of adequate accounting records and internal controls that are designed to prevent and detect fraud and error, and for the accounting policies and accounting estimates inherent in the financial report.

Review approach

We conducted an independent review of the financial report in order to make a statement about it to the members of the company, and in order for the company to lodge the financial report with the Australian Stock Exchange and the Australian Securities and Investments Commission.

Our review was conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards applicable to review engagements, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that would indicate that the financial report is not presented fairly in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*, Accounting Standard AASB 1029 "Interim Financial Reporting" and other mandatory financial reporting requirements in Australia, so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the consolidated entity's financial position, and of its performance as represented by the results of its operations and cash flows.

A review is limited primarily to inquiries of company personnel and analytical procedures applied to the financial data. These procedures do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, thus the level of assurance is less than given in an audit. 
Independence


Statement
